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Introduction

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Introduction

To ensure the delivery of high-quality music education right across England, Arts Council England has extended the opportunity to apply to become a new Hub Lead Organisation (HLO) in two Music Hub areas:

- London South West
- South Yorkshire

Arts Council England first published its <u>Guidance for Applicants to the Music Hub Investment Programme</u> in June 2023. This guidance provided information about what is expected from new HLOs, along with details about how to apply and how the assessment of applications will be carried out.

Organisations that are interested in applying to lead a Music Hub in London South West or South Yorkshire should read this addendum in parallel to the original Guidance for Applicants.

This addendum highlights where there are changes to the original guidance, including updates to essential documents and other supporting materials.



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How much funding is available?

Organisations that are successful with their application to lead either (or both) of the Music Hubs in London South West and South Yorkshire will receive a core revenue grant for an initial period of one year, from 1 September 2024 to 31 August 2025. Following the first year, future funding is planned, subject to the outcome of the next government Spending Review.

In addition, new HLOs will also have responsibility for administering a capital grant for musical instruments.

The grant allocations for both Music Hubs are supplied below:

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Who can apply?

This application process is open to organisations interested in applying to lead either the Music Hub in London South West or South Yorkshire. You can apply to lead both Hubs, but you will need to submit separate applications to ensure proposals are specific to each area.

To be eligible to apply, you will need to be properly constituted and be able to demonstrate your ability to deliver the responsibilities for HLOs, as detailed in the original Music Hub Investment Programme Guidance for Applicants. Any changes to this guidance have been outlined in this addendum.

We continue to welcome applications from consortia, led by a named organisation.

How to apply

All applications to the Music Hub Investment Programme are made through our online application portal, Grantium.

You will need to create an applicant profile on Grantium, if you do not have one already. Your applicant profile will need to be validated by a member of our team, which can take up to 10 working days. Therefore, the deadline for submitting your applicant profile is midday on Tuesday 28 May 2024.

Music Hub areas

This application process is only open to organisations interested in applying to lead the London South West and/ or South Yorkshire Music Hubs.

Introductory conversations

The requirement to have held an introductory conversation with the Arts Council is no longer applicable to this programme.

References made to the introductory conversation process in the original Guidance for Applicants should be disregarded.

You will not be asked to attach evidence of having held an introductory conversation with the Arts Council as part of your application.



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Payment schedule for the core revenue grant

The payment schedule for the core revenue grant differs to the information supplied in the original Guidance for Applicants.

Six payments will now be made over the 2024-25 funding period – percentages indicate the approximate proportion of the grant made available for each payment:

- Payment #1 (September 2024) 16.6%
- Payment #2 (November 2024) 16.6% ۲
- Payment #3 (January 2025) 16.6% ۲
- Payment #4 (March 2025) 8.3% ۲
- Payment #5 (April 2025) 16.6% ۲
- Payment #6 (June 2025) 25%

This payment schedule is applicable to all HLOs, including those appointed through this application process.

All payments are subject to payment conditions being met by the HLO for the 2024-25 funding period. Further information on payment and additional conditions will be made available on our website.



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Capital grant for musical instruments

Significant updates concerning the capital grant for musical instruments have been issued since the publication of the original Music Hub Investment Programme Guidance for Applicants. You should use the information contained within this document to respond to areas of the application relating to the capital grant.

Music Hub Development Plan

You must complete the mandatory Music Hub Development Plan as part of your application on Grantium, setting out the Music Hub's key priorities and milestones, starting from 1 September 2024 up to 31 August 2025 (you can enter earlier activity, from 1 June 2024, if it is relevant to your application).

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Governance and management requirements

You **must** attach a document that contains a draft visual diagram for your proposed governance and management structure in the Attachments section at the end of the application form on Grantium. This is now a mandatory attachment and will form part of our assessment of your proposed governance and management arrangements for the Music Hub you are applying to lead.

You can also attach additional information about your proposed Hub governance and management arrangements, for example a draft terms of reference for your Hub board or equivalent oversight group.

If you are applying on behalf of a consortium, you should attach further information on your consortium arrangements, such as a draft consortium agreement (or equivalent document).

Financial information

The Financial Information template that applicants must complete and submit as part of their application has been updated. You will no longer need to provide your organisation's balance sheet when completing this template.

You will still need to submit a detailed budget for the Music Hub, for the period 1 September 2024 to 31 August 2025. Please include any accompanying notes highlighting whether proposed income is confirmed or expected.

You should also refer to the budget requirements set out in the 2024-25 additional conditions, which will be made available on our <u>website</u>.

You can access the latest template from our <u>website</u>. The completed template must be attached to your application in the Attachments section of the application form on Grantium.

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Conditional offers

We expect to issue final funding agreements to successful applicants in July 2024. We don't expect these to be conditional offers, but payments will be subject to all necessary payment and additional conditions being met, as well as any bespoke conditions applied to the funding agreement.
